

What is non-potable water

The non-potable water supplied to residences in Lancelin South is groundwater (drawn from a local bore) that has only had minimal treatment. The level of treatment applied is only to remove dissolved metals, such as iron. The water is not guaranteed to be safe to drink.

What do I need to be responsible for?

As a householder with non-potable water connected to your home, you will need to ensure that members of your household, visitors and tenants are aware of what non-potable water can be used for. It is important to ensure there is no interconnection of the drinking water and non-potable water supplies. Only licensed/registered plumbers should be engaged to work on recycled water plumbing fixtures.

Ensure the non-potable water meter is kept accessible for water meter readings and any necessary maintenance. For emergencies and leaks please call (08) 9655 -1555.

*What **CAN** I use my non-potable water for?*

Recycled water **CAN** be used for the following purposes:

- Watering plants, gardens and lawns
- Washing cars and paved areas
- Filling ornamental ponds and water features (without fish)

*Recycled water **CAN NOT** be used for any of the following purposes:*

- Drinking, Cooking or other kitchen purposes
- Personal Washing (baths, showers, hand basins and bidets)
- Filling swimming pools and spas
- Recreational activities involving contact (i.e. children playing under sprinklers)
- Evaporative coolers
